School Uniform

This year we have been reviewing our uniform to ensure parents are getting the best value for money. We have negotiated a price reduction on both our summer and winter polo tops, which will take effect immediately. We are also looking at different polar fleece and sports top options to significantly reduce the price without compromising significantly on quality.

We are also looking at the option of changing from culottes to a skort for the girls. The skort would be about \$10 cheaper than the culottes. It is shorter and has less material in the legs. We have placed samples of both the culottes and the skort at reception for you to have a look at. You can vote for your favourite by putting a plastic token in the container of your choice. Our students can vote too. Votes will be counted after school on Friday 8 December so get in quick!

As part of this process we have agreed with our uniform supplier, Janbells, to cease stocking uniform items that are no longer commonly bought. Those items are the girls' tunic, the rain jacket and the polar fleece vest. These items can continue to be worn as
