Strengthen the faith, cultural and social community for families, and the welcome of new families to our community	 The following actions were taken through the year; Specific procedures for welcoming new students through the various Alert Levels were developed. They were specific to the Alert Level and allowed parents several options to choose from in order that they and their child were able to have a positive experience on their arrival at school for the first time. Students and new families were able to be welcomed at School Prayers in Alert Level 1 even though they started and arrived in Alert levels 3 and 4. Parents continue to be offered the opportunity to meet with the Principal after the child has been welcomed at school prayers. School Prayers / Welcome moved to Friday's to see if it better supports the programme learning and determine if more parents are able to attend. This move does better support the programme of learning. There has not been an increase in the number of parents attending. Parents of students who began their schooling were surveyed re their welcome to the school. There was one response. A further survey will be developed and sent to all parents welcomed in 2020. Enrolment procedures are being reviewed in order that they reflect the expectations of the CEO and MOE. Central to this is the grant of a raise in the roll cap from 445 to 558 over a period of three years and the introduction of a zone. Strengthen the knowledge and understanding of our school motto, Mercy Values and Life-Long Learners for our students, teachers and parents	 The Mercy Values and School Motto have been central in ensuring that students have arrived back at school after each lockdown in a consistent caring environment. The 'live' school programme of learning and the 'Online Programme of Learning' have continued to have a strong focus on the Mercy Values and school motto. The lockdowns and resulting Online Programme of Learning have provided parents with the opportunity to be more fully involved in their child's learning and their understanding of the Mercy Values and the school motto within the school's programme of learning. The use of YouTube Principal Channel was a new way in which to share the Mercy Values and the school motto with the students while they were in lockdown. Kakariki Team painted murals to reflect the Mercy Values and these will be displayed on the side of the Admin/Library block. Kakapo team painted tiles to reflect the School Motto and these will be placed on the fence beside the junior playground.

The Leadership Team and teachers developed and maintained an Online Programme of Learning (Distance Learning) website for each team. When developing how the school would develop a Distance Learning programme the following points were considered important: • A range of activities at a range of levels, for each team, that reflect the school curriculum - updated weekly • Not replicating the school day • Providing parents and teachers clear guidelines as to the expectations of students, teachers and parents • Students to be able to communicate with teachers, submitting work, asking questions through email and apps • Teachers able to provide the necessary support and feedback to both students and parents • Accessibility by students and their parents - layout the same for each team - content appropriate to team students are in • A flexible programme without set times for things to be done/completed so that families can work online at times that suit them • Works for students/families that have a limited number of devices between a number of students in the family • Does not require all students in one homegroup to be online at the same time which will not work for all families Equity - ensuring all students have equal access to the programme of learning and their teachers without having to have their privacy intruded on • Student/teacher/family well being - not to put additional pressures on families - clear messaging that they do what they can/want and no more • Student/teacher/family privacy confidentiality/safety • No knowledge of what's happening for students/teachers in their bubbles so want to ensure distance learning is not adding additional stress • Team google sites were available though the breaks and weekends • Future proof - able to be used when teachers working with students both in school and at home as students transition back to school in a safe manner

Prior to entering Alert Level 3 for a second time a review of the Online Programme of Learning was carried out. The addition of a 'live' daily prayers via the YouTube Principal's Channel was made and was well received by the student.

A key aspect of the Online Programme of Learning for the Year 3 - 6 students was the use of the SeeSaw platform. This sees students being able to submit work and receive feedback from their teacher via this online platform. When reviewing our reporting procedure this development was incorporated in the trial reporting procedure.

Communication

Central to this 'unprecedented year' has been effective communication. Throughout the year communication has been consistently under review in order to ensure that all members of the school community; students, staff, parents, Board, parish, have been fully informed. Strategies developed included;

- Ensuring all messages received from the MOE/MOH were immediately conveyed to the staff/parent communities
- Introduction of a COVID-19 tab for the website/email communication
- Development and communication of school procedures for each Alert Level specific to the workings of St Joseph's
- Regular review and communication of procedures for each Alert Level specific to the workings of St Joseph's
- Communication between teachers and students through Alert Levels 3 & 4 via Google Docs, email, SeeSaw and by phone if appropriate following a review of the first lockdown communications
- Consultation and communication with staff through email and google meets through lockdown
- The reduction of meetings held for staff and the introduction of the ability to carry out meetings via 'google meets'
- Board 'catch-ups' / meetings via 'google meets'
- Individual communication with parents of new students to school in order to ensure an appropriate safe supportive first day.

In addition, the following outcomes were achieved;

- (2) Teachers worked with the Mathematics facilitator for two of the four planned PLD sessions. Outcome: Term 1 Introduction of facilitator, sharing of the overview of what Maths is, teachers sharing where they are with Maths, observation of teachers in action, feedback as to the next steps. The facilitator provided support to teams for the maths activities that were provided in the school's Online Programme of Learning during the lockdown. The facilitator is providing advice on student assessment and reporting. Term 3 The Maths facilitator worked alongside teachers individually, met with teams, and carried out a staff meeting.
- (3) Teachers continue to integrate the Digital Technologies
 Curriculum in their programme of learning, including the Online
 Programme of Learning. A plan has been developed to provide
 teachers with opportunities to carry out professional development
 on the Digital Technologies Curriculum. Teachers are beginning to
 upskill themselves to further develop their understanding of the

Digital Technology Curriculum using online courses.

- (4) A digital screen is being trialled to celebrate student achievements. This allows all students and parents to witness student achievements. This is in conjunction with the school newsletters
- (5) Two platforms are used for communicating to the parent/whanau community school website and Etap.

The school website communicates schoolwide information under the following titles;

- School Newsletters (6 pm parent email notification)
- School Notices (6 pm parent email notification)
- COVID-19 (6 pm parent email notification)
- Community/General Notices
- Alerts (Not visible but available to push out information to parents in an Emergency)

Developments have included;

- School Notices with a 6pm notification
- Merger of Community and General Notices
- Introduction of COVID-19 tab
- Newsletter format has been replaced by 'Principal's Message" - more concise

Etap (directly to parent email) communicates;

- Teachers notices specific to their class or team
- Sports notices
- School notices parents need prior to 6 pm
- (6) The Reporting Programme is being developed to incorporate aspects of real-time reporting. SeeSaw was incorporated in the progress and achievement reports this year. Parents have been surveyed on the Progress Report format and this will be analysed. An investigation has been carried out by the Leadership Team as to the Student Management Systems that would best support the Realtime Report format being developed. Etap has been chosen.
- (7) A draft programme with attached resources specific to St Joseph's is being developed
- (8) The music programme is being developed in discussion with the PTA who raised funds through the 2019 Christmas Concert
