

<u>St. Joseph's School Takapuna</u> Kiwi Team - General Information Week One Term One

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to the Kiwi team. We look forward to meeting you and working with your child throughout the rest of 2022.

Our Theme for the term is My School - Toku Kura. In term 1 in Religious Education the children will work within the Introduction to Prayer strand, the Liturgical Year strand and the Jesus Strand learning about 'What Prayer Is' and 'Where They Can Pray' as well as 'Jesus' Life as a Child' and how it compares to their life. At the end of the term we are learning about the stories and traditions of Holy Week. In Mathematics we will be working in the Number and Statistics strands, developing strategies for joining sets together, instantly identifying numbers and sorting objects into groups and talking about how they grouped them. The children will be learning to read simple stories and answer questions about the story and to write stories by recording the sounds they can hear in a word.

Morning and Afternoon Routines

After your child is dropped off (8.15am-8.50am), they will walk to their Home Group, put their bags in the bag area (cloak bay) and put their book bags into their chair bags inside the classroom. Please encourage your child to be independent and let them carry their own school bag as they will need to do these tasks on their own. Any notices being returned to school, should be in a named envelope or snaplock bag and placed in the designated area in the learning space.

All children will be packed up and ready to be picked up from 2.30 pm.

Drink bottles

Your child is welcome to keep a drink bottle inside the classroom. It is important however that the bottles are named and contain <u>only</u> water. It is preferred that these bottles are not iced or wrapped in towels.

Home Learning

Each night your child will bring home a reading book (once the reading programme is up and running). Please sit with your child and listen to them read. Encourage your child to point to each word as they read the text and ask them to tell you the story in their own words. Please remember to write the title in the reading log (in the Home Learning book) and sign it and return the book and reading log to school the following day. Once our Library day is established, your child will bring home a library book or a poem that you can read with or to them.

All library books must be returned to school prior to library day. Religious Education work will come home from time to time with work that needs to be done with family support. Please see that your child completes all work with the reverence it deserves. It is important that this work is returned the next day. Work must be completed using HB pencils for written work and coloured pencils only for illustrations (no felt pens or crayons). Please help us to maintain a high standard of work between school and home.

Parents often ask what they can do at home with their children to make the transition to school easier for the child. Here are a few ideas:

- Basic manners ~ please/thank you etc.
- Can hold and use a pencil
- Provide supervised opportunities to practise using scissors to cut around pictures and shapes.
- Can put on his/her own jersey/jacket.
- Have some alphabet knowledge and familiarity with books.

- Can follow instructions
- Can handle morning tea and lunch items independently.
- Can pack and unpack his/her bag.
- Can express him/herself clearly.
- Can listen carefully
- Show developing responsibility for his/her own personal items.
- Can initiate some conversation e.g. 'Good morning.'

Uniforms

Could parents please ensure that shoes, sun hats, school jumpers, lunch boxes and drink bottles are all clearly named. Lost property increases daily and if items are not named they cannot be returned to the rightful owners.

Behaviour

At St Joseph's we expect children to behave in a way that demonstrates the Mercy values of **Tika** - Justice, **Pono** - Truth, **Aroha** - Compassion, **Manaakitanga** - Hospitality and **Tapu** - Respect for our Environment. We encourage the children to take responsibility for their actions.

Birthdays

We ask that you <u>do not</u> send birthday cakes, 'goody bags', lollipops etc. to school, for the class to share, on your son or daughter's birthday.



Correct Pencil Grip (Left and Right-Handed)


How to Hold a Pencil
