# **Home Learning**

Home Learning Challenges: Continue to encourage your child to complete at least two of the NEW challenges per term. (They are also online on our Kakariki Site).	<b>Reading:</b> Students read their own books for a minimum of 20 minutes each day, including weekends.
<b>Spelling:</b> The children have online activities on StepsWeb to support their learning in this area. This includes student words lists linked to 'The Code' (approx 30 mins across the week).	Maths: Mathletics is used to support the strategies that the children are working on at school. They can also work on number facts and tables at homes (approx 30 mins across the week).

# Kakariki Learning Term 3

#### RE

Students plan prayers for this term before moving on to the Saint Strand. Linking in with our school focus, we will then be looking at Catherine McAuley and the Mercy Order as well as looking at Social Justice.

## Languages

Te Reo and tikanga will be integrated into our programmes throughout the term, as well as being used in our daily greetings and commands. We will also be exploring different cultures and languages during our cultural afternoons.

# Literacu

We will cover a range of text types over the term based around our inquiry topics. The texts will be differentiated to cater for different learners in our classes and the children will have an element of choice with their follow-up tasks.

We will begin the term writing speeches before moving onto writing our own plays. A range of non-fiction text types and report writing will also be incorporated to link with our Inquiry Learning Units.

**Spelling** is part of the weekly Literacy programme. We will be using a programme called The Code and Steps Web to support the teaching and learning programme in this area.

## The Arts

**Drama**: Exploring a range of drama techniques, understanding dialogue and direct speech, Looking at stage directions/actions etc. and character development.

**Visual Art**: Looking at different art techniques and materials relating to our units of inquiry.

**Cultural Groups**: Exploring a range of different cultures through our Monday afternoon rotations (start week 3)..

## Inquiry

Inquiry enables students to learn through curiosity, discovery, and collaboration. When planning these units, we look at cross-curricular links so the children can consolidate their understanding in different areas.

## Some units that we will cover this term are:

<u>Matariki</u> - looking at the meanings behind this special celebration, reflecting and setting goals for the rest of the uear.

<u>Life Education</u> - focusing on friendships, managing big emotions & conflict resolution

<u>Catherine McAuley & the Mercy Order</u> - exploring their love for God, how they helped others and the relevance for our school.

#### Maths

## Weeks 1 - 5: Proportions & Ratios

- Work through a range of problems related to proportions and ratio.
- Practice their knowledge and strategies in this area.

#### Weeks 6-10: Place Value, Addition & Subtraction

- Place value revision of whole and decimal numbers.
- Revision of addition and subtraction strategies.
- Practice solving a range of word problems.

#### Strand focus:

**Geometry:** Shape, Position, Orientation and Transformation.

**Algebra:** Sequential patterns, ordinal positions, tables, graphs, diagrams and spatial patterns.

**Statistics - Probability:** Comparing results with predictions from models of all the outcomes.

## PE / Health

**Cooperative games** in Home Groups, pods and teams, covering a range of skills.

**Cross country training** in Home Groups, pods and teams as the children prepare to run the school cross country on Monday 7th August (week 4).

**Folk Dancing** in Home Groups, helping the children connect basic movement skills to the rhythms and beat of the music.

Learning is a partnership between home and school. Please let us know if there is anything that we can do to support you and your family with your child's learning. Your first point of contact is your child's teacher, followed by Miss Bateman.
